SHAPING A BETTER FUTURE FOR OVER 130,000 NEEDY STUDENTS

With successful fundraising campaign, more less-privileged students to benefit from North West Student Support Fund

To mark the 10th anniversary of the North West Student Support Fund (SSF) this year, the **North West Community Development Council (CDC)** launched a three-month campaign, supported by President Halimah Yacob, to rally the community to raise \$500,000 for needy students. Two-thirds of the way in, the CDC, with the support of companies, schools, and individuals, has already raised over half a million dollars, exceeding the target ahead of time. The funds raised will enable students under North West CDC's care to have access to equal educational opportunities to pursue their dreams. Although the fundraising target has been met, the public can still contribute to the campaign, which will run until 16 August, through the campaign's fundraising page at: **go.gov.sg/give-nwssf** (See Annex A for Media FAQs).

- This year's fundraising efforts build on the foundations laid over the past 10 years to support over 130,000 less-privileged students. To ensure longevity in being able to help needy students, the CDC uses an annual high-point event, the **North West Youth Concert**, as the key platform to engage corporate partners and donors to contribute to the meaningful cause. News of the CDC's successful fundraising this year will be announced by Mdm President at the North West Youth Concert 2022, to be held on 22 July. (See Annex B for Detailed Media Programme)
- Having served as a Grassroots Adviser in the Marsiling Division until 2017, **President Halimah Yacob**, who is the Guest-of-Honour of the event, says, "While the Government continues to build a social net with national assistance schemes and programmes to support the community at large, the CDCs, along with Grassroots Organisations and community partners, also help to assist residents who may have fallen through the cracks. Through the North West SSF and many other assistance schemes by various agencies, I hope that the SG Cares spirit continues to strengthen within the North West Community."
- The CDC plays a pivotal role in connecting resources to serve the needs of the less-privileged residents in the North West, building a culture of giving back and the spirit of care in the North West community. Elaborating on how North West CDC plays an enabler role, **Mayor of the North West District, Mr Alex Yam,** says, "The community's spirit of giving shines through in the toughest times. The North West Youth Concert enables North West CDC to provide less-privileged students with equal learning opportunities to grow to their fullest potential. It is heartening to see the community, particularly, the CDC's strong network of partners, come together to support the SSF fundraising campaign. In addition to helping students, the CDC will continue to address gaps in the community by working with our partners to provide regular support in different areas of need."

- A major strength of North West CDC is its strong corporate network, which have come out in full force. Three companies, Rigel Technology (S) Pte Ltd, Lih Ming Construction Pte Ltd and Aleta Planet Foundation, have each donated \$50,000 in support of the SSF fundraising campaign, providing a boost to the fundraising efforts (See Annex C for Donors' Quotes). The fundraising campaign, a whole-of-community effort, also saw close to 2,000 youths from different groups contribute to the cause. Students from Primary and Secondary Schools actively participated in the fundraising effort through various initiatives, such as doing inhouse fundraising projects or by engaging the community to support a good cause.
- A programme under the North West SSF is the WeCare @ North West Ready For School (RFS) programme, which provides \$200 grocery and book vouchers to needy families. Mishaa D/O Ravikumar, 6, comes from a single-parent household, living with her mother and elder brother. Mishaa's mother, Mdm Vigneswari brings home an average monthly income of \$900, which pays for their housing rent and bills, leaving little for other essentials. The vouchers came as a relief for her family as it enabled Mdm Vigneswari to purchase school necessities for both children, easing some of her financial worries. - With the generous contributions of our donors, we have taken small steps towards realising this year's campaign slogan of 'Nurturing Youths and Warming Hearts'. Beneficiaries' Stories

North West Heart for Students (HFS) Programme

Mohamad Faeez Bin Mohamad Hafis, 15

Every child should be given the opportunity to pursue their dreams and study without having to worry about finances. However, this is often not the case for many students from less-privileged backgrounds such as Faeez. The North West Heart for Students programme hopes to relieve some financial burden for families.

Besides actively participating in the Drama Club after school, Faeez, a Secondary Three student, is one of Fajar Secondary School's top student for his cohort. Back home, while his parents are busy putting food on the table, he would help with household chores. Living with a large family of six, Faeez's family has to be prudent with their expenses. He receives help from Ministry of Education's (MOE) Financial Assistance Scheme (FAS), which takes care of the basic school necessities, such as transport and meal expenses.

However, even with FAS assistance, it is still a challenge for Faeez's family to purchase additional items required for school, such as stationeries and assessment books. With the North West Heart for Student programme, Faeez received an additional sum of money, which he used to purchase assessment books to enrich his learning.

WeCare @ North West - Ready for School Programme

Mishaa D/O Ravikumar, 6

Mishaa comes from a single-parent household, living with her mother and elder brother. Mishaa's mother, Mdm Vigneswari who takes on ad-hoc jobs in the

education sector, brings home an average monthly income of \$900. She uses most of it to pay for housing rent and bills, leaving little for other essentials.

The WeCare @ North West – Ready for School programme, which provides \$200 grocery and book vouchers, came as a relief for her family. Besides putting food on the table, Mdm Vigneswari was able to purchase school necessities for both her children, easing some of her financial worries.

North West Student WISE Enrichment Programme (SWEP)

Wang Yuzhe, 11

Yuzhe is a Primary Five student studying in Qihua Primary School, who was identified to undergo the Student Wise Enrichment Programme (SWEP). He attended a series of workshops such as Active Learning, Public Speaking, Social Etiquette and Cyber Wellness. With the increased use of technology in school, coupled with the rise of social media, students like Yuzhe are more exposed to the risks of the cyber world. Hence, it was timely that Yuzhe learned about the importance of Cyber Wellness and how to identify online scams, to better protect himself. His biggest takeaway was to be socially responsible and accountable for his online behaviour, as well as to be kind to others online.

Lim Jun Le Eleon, 11

The SWEP programme facilitates self-development of student, complementing the core academic curriculum. Eleon was one of the students from Qihua Primary School who had benefitted from the programme. Before attending the programme, he was uncomfortable speaking publicly and would usually shy away from presentations. The workshop helped build his confidence and courage to speak in front of large groups.
