# SELFLESS VOLUNTEERS OF ALL AGES IMPACT LIVES

Contributions of over 150 individuals and organisations recognised at the North West Volunteers' Appreciation 2024

Over 150 volunteers young and old will be recognised for providing care, support, and inspiration to uplift the lives of beneficiaries, and build a caring and healthy North West community together. Through causes such as providing respite care, to inspiring fellow students to give back, to advocating a healthy lifestyle, these volunteers have dedicated their time and service to support the community, collaborating with **North West Community Development Council (CDC)** to harness the CDC's networks and resources in serving the community (see Annex A for media programme). 2 At the North West Volunteers' Appreciation 2024, 65 students will be awarded the North West Outstanding All-Rounder Student Award. 7 of the awardees serve in the North West Youth Assembly (YA), the CDC's youth volunteer group which is actively involved in community work and leading projects that would benefit the less-privileged residents in the North West. One all-rounder student is Admiralty Secondary School's Ms Elly Estigah Binte Mohamed Fadli, who has been an active YA volunteer since 2021. In school, Elly was the President of the Student Council, and has led her peers through many successful school events including National Day and Secondary 1 Orientation. When Elly was nominated by her school to join YA, she became involved in YA's many community projects and even spearheaded an interfaith initiative called Open Voices, which aims to be better educate students about racial issues in Singapore, as well as provide them with a new perspective about the different races in Singapore. Through this project, students can share their personal experiences and learn about sensitive societal issues faced by those around them. As part of her team, she leads and trains nine youth volunteers in facilitation skills to organise dialogue sessions with students. Inspired by her first-hand experience, Elly has enrolled for a Diploma in Community Development, determined to make an even greater impact in the community.

3 Admiralty Secondary School is also one of the 10 schools awarded the **Platinum Award** for **North West Outstanding School Partner Awards** today for its commitment in providing a platform for students to volunteer and contribute their time in the North West community through various community events such as Block Party @ North West which brings residents together to forge community bond within their neighbourhood.

4 On top of celebrating the school community's contributions, 22 volunteers will also be recognised for their efforts. Among them are **Mr Peter Tierney, 57** and **Ms Gurbir Kaur, 55**, who will receive the North West WeCare Volunteer Award, presented to individuals for their stellar contributions to the community. The couple and their two children were introduced to Boys' Town in 2009, and the family has been active volunteers and fundraisers for the organisation for many years. Inspired by Ms Kaur's sister who is a respite carer, the couple began working directly with Boys' Town Sanctuary Care when their own children left home for NS and university. Since 2019 the couple have opened their home to numerous children in need, aged from new born to 5 years old, and often with only a few hours' notice. The Tierneys treasure the memories of their extended respite family and feel privileged to be in a position to help other families through difficult situations.

5 On the healthy living front, another husband-and-wife duo is **Mr** Leng Tian Poh, 61 and Mdm Ong Kwee Heong, 61, North West Brisk Walking Club leader and assistant leader of Marsiling Zone 4, who lead a group of brisk walkers for weekly expedition walks. Not just encouraging their members to lead an active lifestyle, the couple take the initiative to scout for interesting scenic routes and even educates them on historical sites such as Fort Canning Park, Bukit Timah Hill, through their weekly walks. The couple's commitment helped to build up the membership to over 100 members, bringing together many seniors and providing an avenue for them to bond through similar interests (see Annex B for details of media profiles).

6 These volunteers are among 153 individuals and organisations who will be recognised at the annual **North West Volunteers' Appreciation 2024**, which will be hosted by **Mayor of North West District**, **Mr Alex Yam**, and to be held on 12 April 2024 at Singapore University of Social Sciences, Performing Arts Theatre. The awards are based on four categories, including North West WeCare Volunteer Award (for individuals), North West WeCare Partner Award (for organisations), Outstanding School Partner Award, and Outstanding All-Rounder Student Award (see Annex C for media FAQs).

Sharing on the crucial role of volunteers and how they amplify the impact in our North West, **Mayor of North West District**, **Mr Alex Yam** says "The work of the CDCs can only be achieved through collaborations with partners and volunteers. I'm heartened to see many partners and volunteers stepped forward to lend their support – enabling us to engage our residents on a deeper-level and connect resources to promptly meet the needs in the community."

Inspired by her first-hand experience, Elly has enrolled for a Diploma in Community Development, determined to make an even greater impact in the community.

Admirally Secondary School is awarded the Platinum Award for North West Outstanding School Partner Awards for its commitment in providing a platform for students to volunteer and contribute their time in the North West community. The Sanctuary Care team have been very supportive and professional in managing the care process and are very careful and respectful of the families that need their help. The Tierneys treasure the memories of their extended respite family and feel privileged to be in a position to help other families through difficult situations.

## Mr Foo Fang Boon, 70

Mr Foo Fang Boon, 70 has been a North West Brisk Walking (BWC) Champion for over 20 years, advocating healthy living in Nee Soon Central. When North West CDC launched two new programmes – North West FitnessX Club and North West Running Club, Mr Foo drove participation for the clubs and recruited more than 100 members to join. He suffered a stroke in 2023, but that did not stop his commitment towards the Healthy Living Clubs under his care. He continues to encourage members to participate in various key events such as HealthierSG Fest @ North West, FitnessX Sports Fiesta @ North West, and Running Clinic @ North West, to pursue a healthier lifestyle. Through his efforts and active engagement for North West Health Living programmes, there are over 10 BWC, FitnessX and Running clubs in Nee Soon Central and has led to improved holistic health and wellness in his community.
