STRENGTHENING INTERFAITH UNDERSTANDING AMONG YOUTHS

Interfaith Network @ North West provides a unique opportunity for youths to engage religious leaders to understand and discuss faiths in a safe space

Over 100 Secondary One students from Hwa Chong Institution will satisfy their curiosity and be able to discuss topics about Islam and other religions, in a safe space, at the upcoming **Interfaith Network @ North West** programme. Held at **Masjid AI-Iman** on 19 August, the engagement is part of North West Community Development Council (CDC)'s ongoing efforts to promote Inclusive Communities through strengthening the social fabric and building religious harmony. Students joining the Interfaith Network @ North West who are young and still learning about interfaith practices particularly those outside of their own, have a safe platform to build a deeper understanding of one another's religious beliefs and to embrace diversity. Religious leaders from various religious organisations (ROs) will be invited to attend the event and to share their knowledge with the students as well.

2 In partnership with Masjid Al-Iman which will play host, and OnePeople.SG, North West CDC has curated a programme where the students go on an informative guided tour featuring four key stops: (i) the Ablution Area, where students will observe and learn about the ritual of cleansing practices essential for prayer; (ii) the Main Prayer Hall, to understand the central space for congregational prayers, (iii) Our Community Pantry, a place where worshippers and donors contribute food items to support those in need regardless of race or religion; and (iv) the Women's Prayer Area located on a separate floor of the mosque. The programme will culminate in a Dialogue led by Ustaz Muhammad Khaider Bin Rohani, Head of Community Engagement & Outreach from Masjid Al-Iman, and Mayor of North West District, Mr Alex Yam. By encouraging conversation within a safe space, the students will stand to gain deeper insight into both Islam and the commonalities as well as differences of the different faiths in Singapore (see Annex A for Media Programme).

3 Sharing about North West CDC championing Interfaith engagements in the community, Mayor Alex Yam says, "Everyone has a part to play in building and maintaining the racial and religious harmony that we are proud of today. Through our series of Interfaith Network @ North West engagements, we hope to educate our youths by providing them a platform to have an open conversation to clarify any misconceptions and stereotypes associated with people of various faiths, and nurture them to be more understanding of other religious beliefs and practices"

4 Ustaz Muhammad Khaider Bin Rohani from Masjid Al-Iman, believes that providing opportunities to learn about one another's faiths is a crucial part of building religious harmony among the different communities. He adds: "We are honoured to partner North West CDC in the

Interfaith Network series, and find it especially meaningful to open our doors to youths and our community. For many of the Secondary One students from Hwa Chong Institution, it may be their first time stepping into a mosque. We hope that the students will have an enriching and meaningful an outof-classroom experience learning about Islam and the different faiths in Singapore."

5 This is the sixth edition of the Interfaith Network @ North West, which started during Covid-19 pandemic as a virtual engagement aimed at bridging the gap in awareness and understanding of not only one's own faith, but also of other faiths in Singapore. It enabled leaders and followers of the different faiths to come together, without fear and prejudice, to appreciate and understand other faiths more deeply. The first five editions were held at a Church, a Mosque, a Monastery, a Hindu Temple, and the most recent one was a combined session hosted by a Church as well as two Taoist Temples (see Annex B for Fact Sheet).
