LESS-PRIVILEGED BACKROUNDS

Primary school students in the North West District benefit from equal learning opportunity, instilling confidence that they can realise their dreams

This year, for over 200 students from less-privileged background who may not have the same starting point in life as their peers, the **North West Student Wise Enrichment Programme (SWEP)** has given them equal learning opportunity that will better equip them to excel in school and beyond. They follow in the footsteps of around 2,000 students before them, from similarly less-privileged backgrounds, in benefitting from learning soft skills through SWEP. Celebrating its 10th anniversary this year, the programme continues to evolve to maintain its relevance. In 2023, **North West**

Community Development Council (CDC) has introduced a new module on Financial Literacy, which will empower the next generation with financial knowledge and skills from a young age to cultivate good spending habits and build a stronger foundation for their financial awareness.

- To celebrate the 2023 batch of students' successful completion of SWEP and recognise their efforts, the SWEP Graduation Ceremony will be held on 19 November 2023 at the Singapore Zoo. This is the first time that the graduation ceremony will be held outside of school compounds. The ceremony will recognise more than 200 Primary 3 to 6 students who have successfully completed the programme. (See <u>Annex A</u> for Media Programme)
- Mayor of North West District, Mr Alex Yam says, "Not everyone has the same starting point in life. Students from less-privileged backgrounds may have less opportunity than their peers to learn about social skills, which are as important as academic knowledge. The North West SWEP addresses this gap, and fulfils the CDC's role of building a Caring Community. Through SWEP, we hope that the students enjoy their learning opportunities and are able to take away some useful life lessons. I congratulate the graduating cohort and strongly encourage all of them to continue to adopt a mindset of lifelong learning."
- 4 Prior to joining SWEP, 11-year-old Calista Chua was rather shy, making interactions with others challenging. However, her participation in the programme has brought about a noticeable boost in her self-

confidence. In addition, her tendency to spend impulsively has been replaced with a newfound sense of financial responsibility after going through the Financial Literacy module. She now plans, saves, and carefully considers her expenditure. The module has enabled her to recognise the value of money and importance of making thoughtful financial choices. In the eyes of her mother, Crystal Angelica Yusin, 34, SWEP has been instrumental in Calista's development. Crystal shared that the programme has helped provide her daughter with the essential life skills such as financial literacy, polished table manners, and the ability to communicate confidently. These are valuable assets that will serve her well in the future as she continues to engage with and meet new people.

- As the driving force behind the Greenwood Primary School's participation in SWEP, Daniel Ng, 35, Head of Department, Character, and Citizenship Education shares that the programme resonated with their commitment to uplift vulnerable students, and SWEP helps to equip their students with skills to reach their full potential and develop these young minds more holistically. For example, the newly introduced Financial Literacy module helps to develop a strong money sense in the students at a young age, preparing the students for the future. - Working closely with 16 schools in the North West District, North West CDC enrolls student beneficiaries of Ministry of Education's Financial Assistance Scheme or The Straits Times' School Pocket Money Fund into SWEP. In line with the CDC's efforts to uplift students from less privileged backgrounds, the programme is designed to provide equal opportunity for less-privileged students to excel and develop to their fullest potential

through a series of workshops which complement the academic syllabus. The workshops cover topics including listening and communications, social etiquette, and public speaking. (see <u>Annex D</u> for Media FAQs)

Toh Chin Kai, 11, Student

As one of the student speakers at the Graduation Ceremony, Chin Kai, 11, shares that the programme has allowed him to feel more confident when speaking in front of his classmates. His favourite among the modules is Social Etiquette, which brings him great joy in learning the nuances of formal greetings and exploring the intricacies of Western table settings, which he now enjoys adopting into his daily life.

Nur Hazilah Sabihah, 10, Student Harry Shamrizan, 42, Father

Hazilah, 10, shared that SWEP has had a positive impact on her self-confidence. One of the programme's highlights for her is the new Financial Literacy module, which has equipped her with the essential knowledge to manage her finances better and learn the importance of saving money for her future endeavours. On top of that, Hazilah has developed an appreciation for social etiquette, enhancing not only her dining etiquette but also prompting her to share these skills she has learned with her younger siblings.

Her father, Harry, 42, shared his appreciation for her newfound ability to manage her finances, recognising that Financial Literacy is a fundamental skill that every child should possess. In Harry's view, these fundamental skills are essential for children, providing them with the tools to navigate life with confidence and competence.

Hsu Li Ting, 9, Student Wong Wan Wen, 38, Mother

For 9-year-old Li Ting, the one module that stood out as her absolute favourite was Social Etiquette. She shared that the module resonated deeply with her, as her father who is a chef, has instilled a love for all things culinary in their household. At home, she would teach her younger siblings the various dining etiquettes she has learned.
